- 1. Who made this work and why?
- 2. What is the historical context of this work?
- 3. What is the political agenda of the creator?
- 4. What does this work as a whole say about God, mankind, and the state of the world?
- 5. What does this work say is our biggest problem?
- 6. What does this work say is the solution to that problem? Is that solution attainable? Or is life hopeless?
- 7. What message do we get from each character? Is that message the same message the director/author is trying to convey?
- 8. Is the author/director siding with a particular character? How can you tell?
- 9. What does the Bible say about the issues in the work?
- 10. Can you think of any relevant passages from the Bible that support or oppose the themes in this work?
- 11. Is the message of this work Biblical?
- 12. Are there any truths in this work?
- 13. Are there dangerous lies in this work that we should be wary of?
- 14. What does this work have to do with the way we live our lives? What does this work tell us to do?
